hat images come to mind when you read or hear the phrase *The Royal* Canadian College of Organists? The Royal prefix would probably suggest the presence of officially recognized respectability as well as rock-solid stability. In addition, for some it might conjure up a decidedly colonial, specifically Anglo-Saxon, flavour. How do these images relate to the many contemporary realities of the word Canadian? Then again, College implies a whiff of learning (not such a bad thing!) as well as an image of companionship - a collegiality - of like-minded and learned practitioners of intellectual and artistic pursuits. For some, this may be a little intimidating, suggesting special privilege. Organist, the final noun and focus of the entire phrase, clearly states our exclusive interest and activity.

Today, these are not all necessarily viewed as positive images. They may even be considered to be seriously at odds with certain stated elements in our published Aims and Objectives, to wit:

- 1. To provide a high standard of organ playing, *choral directing, church music and composition* [my emphases]; and
- 2. To increase understanding and appreciation among church musicians, church authorities and the public at large of matters relating to church music.

Is anyone troubled, as I am, by an apparent disparity between the image of an exclusive organist fraternity (sanctioned by royal assent and by notions of official respectability) and a stated objective that purports to embrace all matters relating to church music? To truly address matters relating to church music today, we need to be willing to get off the organ bench

occasionally. Musical practices and expectations within the contemporary church are far wider and more disparate than any of us, simply as classically trained organists, can address with integrity. If the College is to enable the skilful practice of church music today, it will have to broaden its focus, it must encourage and enable its members to develop and practise skills that can be quite distant from those conventionally considered appropriate to the organist. We have to encourage organists to broaden their base of skills to include, for instance: a knowledge of repertoire in the so-called 'contemporary' idioms; to become adept at realizing popular music charts at the piano or electronic keyboard; to acquire abilities in effectively arranging hymns, songs and other music for various instrumental and vocal ensembles ... and the list goes on. Traditionally, the organist was viewed with respect as a 'general practitioner' in the local musical scene; this must be no less true today, except that the musical scene and its demands have changed.

I am happy to be able to report that serious conversations having to do with all these matters are currently under way at the national level. So our second century, while not in any way denying the essentials of our original mandate, may witness an expanded view of what it means to be a church musician. I am encouraged by this; I look forward to significant and useful changes within the College over the next few years; I dare to anticipate programs and activities with a broader focus that will increase our perceived relevance to a larger and more inclusive community of church musicians.

A happy Easter season to everyone.

2008/09 Programme of Events

n April we will offer two events on the same day. On April 25th in the afternoon, we will once again host a *Pedals*. *Pipes and Pizza* event at Dominion Chalmers United Church on O'Connor Street in downtown Ottawa. The event will be geared to music students, and in particular piano students who might be interested in the organ, or at least willing to give it a try. As we did last year, we will put the word out through the Ontario Registered Music Teachers Association, but we encourage RCCO members to promote the event in their own churches, places or work and communities. A poster is available for download on our web site.

On the same weekend, we are planning an organ crawl to Rochester New York to visit the Eastman School of Music and organs at the university, or associated with the university, plus others in the city. There have been significant new organ installations in the city over recent years making it a significant destination.

Logistically, this is a challenging event and plans are almost set. Final details will be available soon after final confirmation with some of the Rochester venues. The itinerary, as it stands now, is:

- Leave Ottawa on Friday morning April 24, for arrival in Rochester in and around noon.
- Check into hotel which will cost approximately US\$110 for the night.
- Lunch downtown.
- Travel to University for an afternoon session seeing and visiting the organ department and meeting the faculty, students and staff and of course organs.
- Dinner at approximately 5:30pm and then another session that evening likely with the Rochester Theatre Organ Society and a possible social with some members of the Rochester Chapter of the AGO.

 The following morning and afternoon we will visit three or four more instruments in the community followed by a late lunch and departure by about mid afternoon.

Costs will be limited to travel, accommodation and meals for the 36 hour period. Depending on your route, travel to Rochester from Ottawa will take about 4.5 hours using major highways.

For final planning purposes I need to have firm commitments of intention to attend the event by April 9th. I have a list of members who have already expressed an interest in participating and I will be in touch with these folks by April 6 to confirm their intentions and provide them with the final itinerary and handy check list of arrangements.

assimo Nosetti is titular organist of the Cathedral of Turin, Italy. He is also Professor of Organ and Composition at the Conservatory of Cuneo. He has played in recital in various parts of the world, and has composed and published works for organ, choir and orchestra. His recital at Église Saint-Francois d'Assise (note this change of venue) will include works by familiar composers such as Bach and Mendelssohn as well as some lesser-known Italian composers. For the first time this season, the recital will include an improvisation. Watch the May newsletter for the full programme details.

Student Membership Grant

he RCCO Ottawa Centre is pleased to offer a one-year student membership fee (on a one-time basis) for any organ student meeting the criteria listed below:

- the organ student is studying with an Ottawa Centre member
- the student is between the ages of 16 and 22 (both ages inclusive)
- the student has not previously received this grant
- the organ teacher concerned advises the Executive that his/her student is interested in RCCO membership
- the student meets the criteria for College student membership

To qualify the student for the membership grant, the organ teacher makes a request to the Centre Executive concerning their student. The Centre will provide the membership grant based on the teacher's recommendation and the student's qualification based on the above criteria. Upon Centre approval, the student then makes the application for RCCO membership in the normal way using the form found on the RCCO website, www.rcco-ottawa.ca. The completed form is then submitted by mail to the Ottawa Centre.

Scholarships

he RCCO National Office and the Ottawa Centre have funds available to help members at any stage of their career, to participate in educational and professional development activities.

Ottawa Centre Scholarships

Anthony King-Douglas Gibson Scholarship and Allen Cureton Scholarship

These scholarships, worth up to \$500 and \$300 respectively, are awarded annually to Ottawa Centre members planning to attend a summer course, conference or other professional development activity. The funds can contribute toward the cost of attending an RCCO convention, but must be applied to an organized course or event; not to be used for private lessons. Deadline for applications is April 30, 2009, by letter to the Centre President describing your planned activity, its cost, as well as a brief description of your educational background and present church music activities. When Anthony King, Douglas Gibson and Allen Cureton left money to the College for these awards, it was with the intention of encouraging "continuing" education. Any member of the College is welcome to apply for one of these scholarships to help with the expenses of attending a summer course, or a convention, or other special event that will enhance your ability or inspiration as a church musician. If a little extra money could help you consider that expensive Centennial Convention in Toronto, why not send a request? You have until April 30th to send a letter to the Centre President.

Kiwanis Festival Scholarship

The Ottawa Centre offers a \$500 organ scholarship through the annual Kiwanis Festival of Music and Dance.

The Godfrey Hewitt Memorial Scholarship Trust Fund:

The Godfrey Hewitt Memorial Scholarship was established in memory of the late Godfrey Hewitt, C.D., D.Mus. (Cantuar), FRCO, Hon. ARSCM. Its purpose is to provide an annual scholarship of \$5,000 to an advanced Canadian organ student (or landed immigrant in Canada) who wishes to pursue courses of study either at a university or with a particular teacher, either within Canada or abroad. Funds may be used for tuition, travel, living expenses, and such other purposes as may be appropriate to the circumstances of the award.

Required repertoire for the following spring's competition will be announced in the autumn of each year.. All applicants shall satisfy the following requirements:

- Canadian citizenship, or landed immigrant status in Canada;
- aged 35 years or less;
- graduate, or about to graduate from university, conservatory or college;
- RCCO Associate diploma or similar academic level of qualification;
- stated intention of teaching organ (either in an academic institution or privately, not necessarily as the candidate's primary career).

Application forms and submission details are available on the RCCO Ottawa Centre web site (www.rcco-ottawa.ca), or may be requested in writing from:

Applications must include: 1) a detailed resumé and proof of citizenship or landed immigrant status, 2) a specific plan of study for the year, 3) three references, 4) a cassette/CD made in the past 12 months of three major works (see web site for details) and 5) a non-refundable fee of \$40 payable to RCCO—Ottawa Centre. Deadline for submissions is **April 30th, 2009.** Since 2007, the Hewitt Memorial Fund has also provided a Prize at the bi-annual National Organ-Playing Competition of the RCCO; from 2011 on, this will constitute the Grand Prize of \$5,000.

National Office Scholarships:

Lorna & Murray Holmes Scholarship:

The annual Lorna and Murray Holmes Scholarship provides \$1,000 to a student entering organ or church music studies at a Canadian University. Preference will be given to students beginning undergraduate studies. Applicants must hold membership in the College. A letter of application must be accompanied by a proof of acceptance at a Canadian university, and two letters of reference from people able to assess the candidate's suitability for the scholarship. 
