
There's still lots to come in May and June, and we are already at work to provide another engaging season beginning in September. We look forward to seeing you at these events.

Valerie Hall, Past President, RCCO, presents a workshop on **Western Canadian Organ Music** at Paroisse St-François-d'Assise, 20 Fairmont Avenue (corner of Wellington).

In this workshop, Past RCCO President Valerie Hall will provide some recent offerings suitable for service use by Western Canadian composers. These will include works for organ by non-RCCO composers as well as her favorites by Nicholas Fairbank (British Columbia) and Jacobus Kloppers (Alberta). In addition, selections from a brand-new RCCO Publication of organ pieces will be presented.

A native of Winnipeg, Valerie Hall studied at the University of Manitoba and Concordia University in Illinois. Organist at Holy Rosary Cathedral in Regina since 2002, she has also been the Director of Music there since 2007. She also works as a harpsichordist and continuo player, performing regularly with Ensemble Agrément, Per Sonatori, and the Regina Symphony Chamber Players. She is the immediate Past President of the RCCO, and has also served as National Chair for Membership and as Regional Director for the Prairies, while remaining active on the College's Board of Directors.

Don't miss the final concert of this season, on MONDAY, May 14th, at 7:30 p.m., at Église Saint-François-d'Assise! Our national Past President, Valerie Hall, will play a varied programme that will include music by our favourite composers, Rachel Laurin and Gilles Leclerc, as well as other early and later music.

Valerie Hall is Organist and Director of Music at Holy Rosary Cathedral in Regina, Saskatchewan, where she presides over one of Canada's finest church organs. She is a champion of Canadian composers, and has played Canadian works in concert across Canada and the United States, as well as in Europe. Here is the

programme for May 14th: pieces from Louis Marchand's 1740 Livre d'orgue; two Leipzig chorales by J.S. Bach; Récit de tierce en taille by Gilles Leclerc; Paean on "Divinum Mysterium" by John Cook; Jehan Alain's Variations sur un thème de Clément Jannequin; Prelude and Fugue in f minor by Rachel Laurin - the one that won the 2008 Holtkamp-AGO award; Viatore by Peteris Vasks; and Praeludium in f# minor by Buxtehude.

Those who come on the 14th will also be the first to see the line-up for next season; we plan to have the 2012 - 2013 flyer ready for that evening.

Member of the Year

Ross Jewell



We are extremely fortunate to have very talented and dedicated individuals in the Ottawa Centre who have contributed greatly to the work of the College over the years and particularly to this Centre. One individual who has been "instrumental" in this pursuit has been Ross Jewell. Although very busy over the years with his work and singing, Ross found time to devote to the RCCO nationally and to the Ottawa Centre. In his own words, Ross gives his account of how he became involved in the RCCO:

In 1976, Lorne Swan, a friend from University, was the treasurer of the Ottawa Centre. When he moved to Toronto, he asked me if I would like to take on the job. At that time I said no, but he then had the Centre President call me to ask me to be treasurer. I was rather surprised when I got a call from Gerald Bales asking me to be treasurer. Even though I am not an organist, I have always been passionate about organ music and many of my friends were organists, so I agreed. After a few years, I left the position to become Advertising coordinator and also treasurer of the 1983 Convention. After the Convention I became treasurer again.

In 2003, Frances, myself and Chris Dawes (National Communications Director) were having lunch and talking about RCCO and communications. At one point in the conversation, I mentioned that the RCCO should set up a web page to communicate to our members and the wider public. We chatted about that for a few minutes then went on to other topics. I was surprised a few weeks later to get an e-mail from Chris asking how the web design was coming! I then realized

that with any volunteer organization, if you make a suggestion, you had better be prepared to act on it, so I set up the national website and our own Centre website.

Ross has been active in various choirs. He sang at Christ Church Cathedral for 30 years and is now completing 36 years with Cantata Singers. In 1973/4, he built a Zuckermann Harpsichord which has given him many years of enjoyment. In 2001, Ross received the Distinguished Service Award at the Convocation of the RCCO National Convention in Toronto. Ross not only looks after the general account as well the Pro Organo and several scholarship accounts, he has to file reports to Revenue Canada to maintain our charitable status. Ross is spending many hours this year setting up the Orgelfest 2013 Convention website with on-line capability to buy tickets and to donate to the Convention. It is with much pleasure and gratitude, that the Ottawa Centre recognizes Ross for his past and continuing dedication to the College and this Centre.

Angela Hewitt Comes to Ottawa

you know, Ottawa's internationally-famous concert pianist, Angela Hewitt, is to be the headline artist at our National Convention in August 2013. We therefore want to let you know about a unique event that Angela will be presenting at the National Arts Centre in Ottawa on Sunday, May 20th, 2012, as a fundraiser for her annual Trasimeno Music Festival in Italy.

As part of what Mayor Jim Watson has declared "Angela Hewitt Week in Ottawa" - May 13 - 20, 2012 - (Angela is also playing with Chamber Players of Canada on May 18) - there will be a combination event at the NAC on Sunday, May 20th. At 3:00 pm, courtesy of the CBC, we will show the film of the telecast of the Finals of the 1985 International Bach Piano Competition in which Angela took First Prize. This historic film, which lasts one hour, is introduced by conductor Sir Andrew Davis, and follows the four finalists (two Russians and one German besides Angela) in their solo and orches-

tral performances. The film will be shown in the Studio of the NAC, accompanied by a special exhibit showing the evening gown that Angela wore that night in 1985. Angela will then perform for us briefly on the piano. This part of the event will be open to the general public by donation at the door.

Immediately following, in the NAC Salon, there will be a private VIP reception with refreshments, where there will be an unprecedented display of about twenty of Angela's concert gowns. The reception will last from 4.30 until 7 p.m. Hyperion Records has agreed to a special early release, for Canada only, of Angela's new recording - music by Schumann performed by Angela and the Deutsches Symphonie-Orchester Berlin under conductor Hannu Lintu. Angela will be glad to sign copies of the new CD at the reception. Admission to this unique reception in the Salon is \$100 per person, for which a tax receipt of \$65 will be issued.

Space is limited at this reception in the



Mark Thallander Foundation Choral Festival

any members of our Ottawa Centre have met California organist Mark Thallander who spoke at our Ottawa Convention in 2003 on "What's in Your Blender?"

Mark's personal story in recent years is an amazing one. Recovering from a horrific vehicle rollover accident in 2003 that claimed his left arm, he continues to play the organ with great skill and enthusiasm.

At the time of Mark's accident a not-for-profit foundation was established by his many friends to honour him through the promotion of church choral

music. Since 2005 the Mark Thallander Foundation has sponsored over twenty events bringing choirs from various churches together for festivals of worship. The number of singers has ranged from over 1000 (at several of the annual festivals in the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels in Los Angeles) down to more modest gatherings of 50 to 60 singers in

New England towns where individual church choirs often struggle to gather even a handful of singers. A feature of each festival has been the presence of a leading

> American choral conductor to prepare the choir members for an exciting evening of praise. Further details about the Foundation, its festivals and recordings can be found at www.markthallanderfoundation.org.

On Sunday evening, June 3rd, at 7:00 p.m., the Foundation will be holding its first Canadian festival at St. Paul's Presbyterian Church,

Ottawa. Mark, a good friend of St. Paul's organist Ross Dixon, has been coming to Ottawa frequently for over the past ten years to play the organ for special services at St. Paul's. The June festival, entitled "One Lord, One Faith, One Hope", is expected to include over 70 singers from four local church choirs: Barrhaven

United, Know Presbyterian (Manotick), First United (Westboro), and St. Paul's Presbyterian. Instrumental accompaniment for the evening will include organ, piano, trumpet, strings and percussion. (See Around Town on page 3).

The festival's guest conductor will be Rev. Thomas Matrone, Minister of Music



at Central Assembly of God in Springfield, Missouri. Pastor Matrone leads a thriving ministry of music at Central Assembly where three worship celebrations are held each Sunday in a spacious, 2,500-seat sanctuary.
