President's Message

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Pro Organo Poster

I've been practicing the organ for years (decades) and I have some very vivid and timeless memories of practice sessions that seem to have happened long ago but that might have happened in the recent past. I have had the privilege of practicing on some very good organs but my memory is not so much of those organs. I remember a few wonderful stops - nice gentle flute stops and a few really big pedal reads. I remember some beautiful buildings, fine oak and rich carpeting. But what I remember most is the vast dark empty space.

Many of us will have had similar experiences, I hope. Late on a Saturday night, in the depths of February, setting out to do some last minute practice. The building is a large church - not large by the standards of a European cathedral but large enough. The few lights that are on are just enough to light the way from the back door of the chancel to the organ bench but the walls of the rest of the building are so far away that the light does not fill the space. Perhaps a candle flickers in the distance but not it is not enough to give any sense of scale. In the darkness, the room seems to go on forever. And it is often cold - there is little heat for the organist to practice - visions of Bob Cratchet shaking by the coal fire from when my annual viewing of Dicken's A Christmas Carol a few weeks ago.

Going about the business at hand, the organ is turned on, the music is placed carefully on the music rack and I begin to work on those

one or two passages that still give me some concern. Slowly the music builds with a warmth that fills what seems to be an almost infinite space. Bach is pervading what, to me in the darkness, I can imagine to be the whole of reality. For a wonderful few minutes, with the focus of someone who must play in the morning, the entire universe contains me, this organ and the heavenly music of Bach. There is simply nothing else - no problems, no politics, no bills, no tiredness. Then I lift the final chord prepared to start again, perhaps a little more work on bar 74 and something happens. First, the sudden silence, then, a gust of wind causes one of the windows, high up in the nave, to rattle and the roof creaks just a little bit.

I'm not generally afraid of the dark but being in such a large space that is suddenly so empty, so full of the unknown, certainly encourages a little bit of adrenaline to enter the blood stream and I know there are only two choices. Either it is time to pack up and leave (not in a panic but quickly nonetheless) or, I must play again. Once more through that prelude, filling the space with the music of Bach and holding back the unknown, pushing the darkness out of that once so empty space.

Experiences like this are only experienced by a few. Not all have had the opportunity to fill a vast space with power and majesty, seemingly forcing back into the darkness the evil spirits that shake the rafters trying to get in. ... continued on page 2

Practice can be lonely - perhaps it should be. Practice is work - progress requires effort and persistence. But practice on an organ in a church is also a high privilege. Be present in your practice time and treasure those times - times that are perhaps not quite enjoyable but very, very much alive and sometimes just a little frightening - when, alone, you can push back a little on the darkness and fill a vast space with the power of music.

As announced, the concert will take place at Notre-Dame Cathedral-Basilica (Sussex at Guigues), and the featured artist will be Hans-Ola Ericsson. Hans-Ola Ericsson was born in Stockholm, Sweden. He studied organ and composition there and in Freiburg, Germany, in the USA, and in Venice and Paris. In 1989, he was appointed full Professor of Organ Performance at the Luleå University of Technology in Sweden. He performs throughout Europe, and in Japan, Korea and Canada, and has worked closely with several composers, including Messiaen. His recording of

the complete organ works of Messiaen is highly acclaimed.

In 2000, he became a member of the Royal Academy of Music in Stockholm. Since 2011, Professor Ericsson has been Professor of Organ Performance and University Organist at McGill University in Montreal.

Hans-Ola Ericsson's programme on MARCH 6 will include works by Sibelius, Anonymous, Hambraeus, J.S. Bach, Bach/ Reger, Rameau and Messiaen. Full details will be published next month, or you can consult the Centre web-site.




