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occasion I have often heard musicians, including a few organists, question their selection of music. Most musicians choose music to play in public. Organists choose music for many different reasons. We choose liturgical settings, choral music, sometimes hymns as well as music for solo organ such preludes, offertories and postludes.

It is good to be thoughtful about our musical choices but we should be wary when the basis for our questioning moves to the difficulty of the music. Surely the level of virtuosity required to play a musical work should not be the prime consideration in its selection. Perhaps it should not even be a consideration, as long as the music lies within our abilities.


Admittedly there are occasions when the "level' of a piece is an important consideration, for example, a college exam or in university study. To the extent that an effort is being made to improve one's skill, a challenging work can be the correct choice – better still, a piece that gradually increases our skills.

In choosing a prelude or postlude, is the technical level of the choice even relevant? It is important to remember that the most beautiful music or the most appropriate music is often not the most technically challenging of options. Sometimes the best choice may be a simple piece. Rejecting an appropriate piece of music because we do not think it is difficult enough or because we are worried about how others would react if we played something "that easy" is, I think, wrong.

> Jean Desmarais, Ottawa based pianist, performing artist and pedagogue, once defined musician for me. Jean says, "a musician is someone who plays music". It is a short, clear and yet powerful definition. It is important to be absolutely clear that a musician is not someone who plays virtuosic music. In making music selections, the correct choice of repertoire is music, not necessarily difficult music.


A 20-passenger bus will be our primary mode of transportation. Fees for the day, including bus, are:



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Hans-Ola Ericsson Concert Review

Those who braved the cold late winter night to attend the stellar performance by Swedish organist Hans-Ola Ericsson were not disappointed; indeed they were rewarded to an evening of organ repertoire by composers from Sweden, Finland, Germany, and France.

Ericsson is the Professor of Organ Performance and University Organist at McGill University in Montreal and has performed throughout Europe, Japan, Korea and Canada.

The program started with *Intrada* by Finnish composer Jean Sibelius. This was his first organ composition. We were greeted by a very stately and grand ambiance – with full complement of mixtures and reeds blazing. And one could imagine the nationalistic atmosphere

as it was played in the presence of the visiting King and Queen of Sweden in 1925. The *Largamente molto* tempo with its bold registration was very convincing and got the program off to a rousing start.

Magnificat in D (1er Ton) Livre d'Orgue de Montreal : Ericsson was meticulous in his choice of registration and articulated all voices and ornamentation with utmost transparency. Fellow Swedish composer Bengt Hambraeus composed largely for the organ, with a significant output to his credit.

Shogaku was inspired by the ancient Japanese Imperial music which is based on the pentatonic scale. This composition certainly demonstrates that his organ music developed in new directions. The playing medium was not restricted to just fingers and feet, but also elbows and palms. If there were any listeners lacking enthusiasm for the tonality or lack thereof, they were surely stirred by the lively rhythmic structure and colourful use of registration.

Ricercare a 6 voci from Bach's *Ein musikalisches Opfer (BWV 1079). The Musical Offering BWV 1079*, is a collection of canons, fugues and other pieces of music by Johann Sebastian Bach. It is based on a musical theme by Frederick the Great, of which the *Ricercar a 6*, a six-voice fugue is the highpoint of the entire work. Great care was given throughout with his choice of registration to give clarity to each voice.

After the intermission we heard the Bach *Chromatische fantasie*. This composition was transcribed from harpsichord to organ by Max Reger. With

his choice of tempo and slightly detached touch, Ericsson gloriously portrayed Bach in all his contrapuntal splendour. His tasteful registration and use of the crescendo pedal as a Rollschweller brought the piece to a magnificent ending. This was the first exposure of this masterpiece to this listener, and may it not be the last.

Livre d'orgue de Monsieur Rameau. Les Indes galantes is an opera-ballet by Rameau transcribed by Yves Rechsteiner. This brilliant set of pieces gave the listener a vivid aural sense of the wonderful variety of stops on the Notre Dame instrument. His colourful use of registration depicted the variety of moods from the very intimate Tendre amour, choer de voix humaines to the robust


> Danse des Sauvages, dans le gout du concerto. The resources of the sanctuary organ, especially the musette, were used for special effect.

Le Fils, Verbe et Lumiere -Messiaen This was a stirring performance which captured the dialogue between the plainsong theme and coloured chordal progressions. As a former student of Messiaen, surely Ericsson is a worthy messenger of the composer's original intentions.

Kudos to Pro Organo for inviting this artist. We are indebted to Hans-Ola Ericsson for sharing his insight and musical prowess with those gathered, and for the superb use of the resources of the Notre Dame instrument. The quality of organ teaching and mentoring at McGill University is in good hands, and the next generation of organists will be inspired by this brilliant musician.

The Ottawa Centre offers a \$500 organ scholarship through the annual Kiwanis Festival of Music and Dance.

The Godfrey Hewitt Memorial Scholarship Trust Fund:

The Godfrey Hewitt Memorial Scholarship was established in memory of the late Godfrey Hewitt, C.D., D.Mus. (Cantuar), FRCO, Hon. ARSCM. Its purpose is to provide an annual scholarship of \$5,000 to an advanced Canadian organ student (or landed immigrant in Canada) who wishes to pursue courses of study either at a university or with a particular teacher, either within Canada or abroad. Funds may be used for tuition, travel, living expenses, and such other purposes as may be appropriate to the circumstances of the award.

Required repertoire for the following spring's competition will be announced in the autumn of each year. All applicants shall satisfy the following requirements:

 Canadian citizenship, or landed immigrant status in Canada;

- aged 35 years or less;
- graduate, or about to graduate from university, conservatory or college;
- RCCO Associate diploma or similar academic level of gualification:
- stated intention of teaching organ (either in an academic institution or privately, not necessarily as the candidate's primary career).

Applications must include: 1) a detailed resumé and proof of citizenship or landed immigrant status, 2) a specific plan of study for the year, 3) three references, 4) a cassette/CD made in the past 12 months of three major works (see web site for details) and 5) a non-refundable fee of \$40 payable to RCCO—Ottawa Centre. Deadline for submissions is April 30th, 2015. The Godfrey Hewitt Memorial Scholarship of \$5,000 has been awarded annually to advanced Canadian organ students each year since 2005.

The Godfrey Hewitt Memorial Prize of \$5,000 will be awarded as the Grand Prize at the National Organ-Playing Competition held by the RCCO biannually in conjunction with the College's National Convention in odd-numbered years; the next Grand Prize will be awarded at the Winnipeg Organ Festival this summer.

The Lorna Holmes Scholarship is available annually, and provides \$1,000 to a student entering organ or church music studies at a Canadian University. 
