appy Easter! I trust we are still basking in the glow of all the delightful Easter music we have heard or participated in throughout Holy Week and on Easter Sunday. No doubt for all of us there are certain hymns, anthems and instrumental pieces that bring us fully into the Easter season. For me, and for many people, Charles Wesley's hymn Christ The Lord Is Risen Today is the musical highlight to the Easter season. The "Alleluias" were not part of the original hymn but provide a wonderful way to augment and respond to the soaring melody and the telling of the Resurrection story. Wesley's original hymn also included eleven stanzas! How would one ever find that many different organ registrations for the singing of that hymn?

One cannot speak of Easter music without mentioning J. S. Bach. "Fueled by his Lutheran faith, J. S. Bach devoted his life to creating music for refreshment, proclamation, and praise." (Calvin Stapert). Bach's B Minor Mass, often performed on Good Friday, is to me his consummate creation. If you have not yet had your fill of listening to and experiencing Bach's works, I invite you to attend the RCCO Ottawa's "The Great Bach Marathon 2". It is happening on Saturday April 14 from 1:30 – 6:00 p.m. at Woodroffe United Church. "Pianists, singers, strings and organists, students and adults, learning and experienced, all performing the works of J.S. Bach". You are invited to come when you can and leave when you must. Admission is free but donations will be accepted to benefit the scholarship fund for the young organists of our city. I hope to see you there!

Next Pro Organo Ottawa concert featuring Rachel Mahon will take place at Rideau Park United Church, Alta Vista and Cunningham. on Friday, April 6th. This concert will be co-sponsored by the Godfrey Hewitt Memorial Scholarship Fund, since Rachel Mahon counts among her many awards, the Godfrey Hewitt Memorial Scholarship.

She is currently the Assistant Organist at Chester Cathedral in England. Before taking up her post at Chester, Rachel Mahon was the first female organ scholar of St. Paul's Cathedral in London, England, assuming the post in September 2014. There, she played for several high profile events, including those in the presence of royalty. Before taking up her post at Chester, she was the first female organ scholar of St. Paul's Cathedral in London, England.

Rachel was raised in Toronto, where her parents were both choir directors. She initially began studying piano, but switched to organ in 2005 after hearing Widor's famous Toccata. She won a scholarship from the Royal Canadian

College of Organists to begin studying with Melva Graham, and in 2007 continued under Andrew Ager. She received the degree of Bachelor of Music in organ at the University of Toronto School of Music under John Tuttle.



Rachel Mahon has held organ posts at several churches in Toronto, and in England. In 2012, she and fellow organist Sarah Svendsen founded the duo *Organized Crime* in which the two organists entertain audiences not only with their music, but with their crazy antics. Rachel has won several awards for organ performance, including second in the 2013 Canadian National Organ Playing Competition here in Ottawa. In addition, she has been awarded a graduating scholarship from the Faculty of Music, University of Toronto and the Godfrey Hewitt Memorial Scholarship from the RCCO.

She has performed with a number of choirs: the Toronto Mendelssohn Choir, the Elora Festival Choir, and the Tallis Choir, among others. As the William and Irene Miller Organ Scholar at St. Paul's in London, Rachel was responsible for directing choir rehearsals, performing for church services, playing in recitals, and acting as assistant choir librarian, among other duties.

The programme on April 6th will include works by Buxtehude, Tomkins, Howells, Messiaen, MacMillan, Schumann, Dupré, Vaughan Williams and Bach-Guilmant. Full details of her program are available on the Ottawa Centre web-site.

The Ottawa Centre offers a \$500 organ scholarship through the annual Kiwanis Festival of Music and Dance.





The Godfrey Hewitt Memorial Scholarship was established in memory of the late Godfrey Hewitt, C.D., D.Mus. (Cantuar), FRCO, Hon. ARSCM. Its purpose is to provide an annual scholarship of \$5,000 to an advanced Canadian organ student (or landed immigrant in Canada) who wishes to pursue courses of study either at a university or with a particular teacher, either within Canada or abroad. Funds may be used for tuition, travel, living expenses, and such other purposes as may be appropriate to the circumstances of the award.

Required repertoire for the following spring's competition and other requirements can be found on the Centre website: www.rcco.ca/scholinfo.html. All applicants shall satisfy the following requirements:

Canadian citizenship, or landed



immigrant status in Canada;

- aged 35 years or less;
- graduate, or about to graduate from university, conservatory or college;
- RCCO Associate diploma or similar academic level of qualification;
- stated intention of teaching organ (either in an academic institution or privately, not necessarily as the candidate's primary career).

National Office Scholarships

The Lorna and Murray Holmes Scholarship

The Lorna Holmes Scholarship is available annually, and provides \$1,000 to a student entering organ or church music studies at a Canadian University. Preference will be given to students beginning undergraduate studies. Applicants must hold membership in the College. A letter of application must be accompanied by a proof of acceptance at a Canadian university, and two letters of reference from people able to assess the candidate's suitability for the scholarship. Barrie Cabena Music Scholarship

The Waterloo-Wellington Centre administers the Barrie Cabena Music Scholarship. The Barrie Cabena Music Scholarship Fund was initiated by the Waterloo Wellington Center of the RCCO in 2004 on the occasion of Dr. Cabena's 71st birthday. Contributions may be made to the "RCCO Cabena Scholarship".
